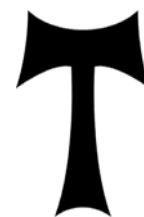

Dear Parishioners,

When you think about it, our world is full of signs. It is not surprising, then, that Christianity also makes use of this phenomenon. Of all the signs that represent christianity, none is more identifiable than the cross. Christianity's link with the cross is so intimate, so cherished, that it can never be separated.

Interestingly, Christianity did not use the cross as its sign until early in the fourth century. It was then that a junior emperor named Constantine received a vision. While preparing for battle against a far superior foe, Constantine heard a voice saying, "in this sign, conquer." Along with this voice came a vision of the cross of Jesus Christ. Constantine immediately affixed this sign of the cross on his soldiers' breastplates and on their flags. Then, led by the cross, Constantine charged into battle. Sure enough, Constantine's army secured a victory so complete that it led to the reunification of the Roman Empire under his leadership. It only made sense, then, that when Constantine converted to Christianity and legalized Christianity a few years later, he also made the cross its official emblem.

There could be no more perfect symbol for the Christian than the cross. For the cross represents everything it means to be a follower of Jesus Christ. It symbolizes the power of our human weakness, the strength in our humility. Think about this for a minute. Jesus Christ, the second person of the Blessed Trinity, does not cling to this status. Rather, He gives it up to become something infinitely less dignified, a human being.

But, the humiliation Jesus Christ endures doesn't end there. Jesus also condescends to suffer the most terrifying, most horrific of all human experiences – the experience of death. Of course, Jesus' death was not just any death. Rather, it was one of the most horrific and one of the most humiliating deaths imaginable – the death reserved only for the most heinous of criminals - - death on the cross.

Yet, with all His glory stripped away and nothing further left to give, Jesus is exalted by God and restored to His rightful place at His Father's right hand. You see, only in this most profound of humiliations was Jesus able to manifest the depths of His strength, and in this most profound of weaknesses demonstrate the limitlessness of His power.

This is the best part. For the power demonstrated by the humiliation of Jesus Christ on the cross is so strong that it even transcends time. For the Christian, the wood of the cross becomes the new tree of life. For just as Adam and Eve could eat from the fruit of the old tree of life and never die, so, too, the Catholic Christian can eat from the fruit of the new tree of life, the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, and live forever. For the power that emanates from the triumph of the weakness of Jesus Christ has no limitation, not even time.

All these insights are contained in the most beautiful, most profound sign of Christianity, the cross, which we celebrate in a special way on September 14. Hopefully, the sight of the cross serves to provide us with the same encouragement in our own adversity that it did to the emperor Constantine eighteen centuries ago . . . "in this sign, conquer!"

The meeting of the endowment board opened with prayer led by Fr. Olsen at 4:02 PM on Wednesday, August 6, 2019.

Those present were Fr. Eric Olsen, Zane Abner, Bill Albracht, Mark Brockhaus, Jan Kessler-Fischer and Lisa Krings. Len Hassenstab and Bryan Reichmuth were excused. Melvin Sueper was absent.

Fr. Olsen would like to set up an estate planning seminar for our cluster parishes to help increase awareness of the importance of including the church in estate planning.

Mike Lighthart, our financial advisor from Merrill Lynch, gave an informational presentation on our endowment past and present.

Beginning in 2017, Merrill Lynch began offering a Catholic Value Screened investment option. We will not go with that option right now. We will revisit the idea at our next meeting and see how those investments are doing.

Investment Activity

We have two CDs coming due soon through Merrill Lynch; one on August 6 and one on December 16. The board decided unanimously to move these funds, along with the cash currently being held by Merrill Lynch and waiting to be invested, into mutual funds in an effort to continue to move toward a better balance between equity and fixed income.

The next meeting of the endowment board will be in July of 2020, shortly before the next CD comes due.

The meeting adjourned at 5:33 PM with a prayer led by Fr. Olsen.

FINANCE BOARD MEETING MINUTES
AUGUST 14, 2019

The meeting of the finance board opened with prayer led by Bryan Reichmuth at 8:16 PM on Wednesday, August 14, 2019.

Those present were Fr. Olsen, Dan Fehringer, Dave Krings, Brandon Morfeld, Kevin Small, Carol Wemhoff, Bryan Reichmuth, Paul Ramaekers, Tim Werner, Lisa Krings and Ashley Krings.

Financials

The financial reports were reviewed.

The cafeteria has installed a reverse-osmosis system. The old water softener was shot and needed to be replaced. The dishwasher seems to be cleaning better now.

Pastor's Comments

Fr. Olsen expressed his appreciation for the welcoming and understanding during the transition.

Fr. Olsen sees that we are spending more than we are taking in, and we need to find a way to balance the budget. He shared that parishes never have financial problems, only spiritual. The financial problem is only a symptom of the spiritual problem. People will sacrifice for those things for which they see value. If we give to God the 10% He asks, we are free to enjoy the other 90% on the other things that bring us joy.

One way we are working to balance the budget is through rethinking the allocation of our endowment. As CDs mature, we are moving those funds into mutual funds that yield a better return but are still relatively conservative. With a 3% increase in return, we could see a \$24,000 increase in earned interest.

An addition, we are working toward making the most of every dollar by combining designated funds that are not yet being used into a higher interest-bearing account.

Sharing priest expenses with cluster parishes saves the parish money as well.


The board encourages parishioners to enroll in EFT (electronic funds transfers) for their Sunday giving. Enrollment requires filling out a simple form at the parish office. Many families already use EFT for Sunday giving, tuition and lunch payments, and campaign pledge payments. It was discussed that perhaps parishioners hadn't thought about the fact that the \$20 a week they gave ten years ago doesn't go as far as the \$20 they give today due to inflation. Regardless of each parishioner's financial situation, we are ALL in the top 1% in the world, and this is only because of God's generosity.

Our next meeting will be Saturday, September 21, at 8 AM.

The meeting closed with a prayer led by Fr. Olsen at 9:31 PM.
