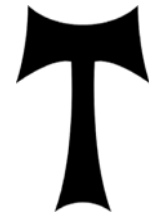

For true baseball fans, the two best words in the English language are “Play Ball!” What is unfortunate, however, is that more and more families are unable to afford the luxury of attending a Major League Baseball game. In fact, the average cost for a family of four to attend a game at Fenway Park to watch the Boston Red Sox is \$336.99 in 2007, the highest in the country. Of course, given the staggering increases in players’ salaries recently, this makes perfect sense. For the reality is that Major League Baseball is BIG business; to the tune of \$6.6 billion in 2009! That is only slightly less than the top revenue-producing sport, the National Football League, which took in \$7.8 billion that same year.

Perhaps surprisingly, though, there is another leisure activity that may be replacing baseball as our national pasttime. In fact, that activity generates as much revenue as both the NFL and MLB combined. What is that industry? Pornography. Precise figures are hard to come by, and more recent studies are not available partly because there is always a debate about what constitutes pornography and no real desire on the part of the industry to reveal its revenue. Nevertheless, conservative estimates suggest that \$13.3 billion was spent on legal pornography in 2006 in the United States alone (three years BEFORE the same amounts used for MLB and the NFL above; undoubtedly the figure would be significantly higher by 2009, and even higher today).

Of course, some might argue that pornography is not really all that bad. Since pornography is used largely in secret, perhaps it’s not really hurting anybody. That’s simply not true. Regardless if its use is secret, pornography is hurting everybody; including the user, the participants, society, but especially women. Not only are more and more women tempted to the quick and easy money pornography promises by denigrating themselves to be used in such a lucrative industry, but, also, pornography colors the way men look at women as well as the way women look at themselves and the way women look at men. This phenomenon is why users so often forget that the people they are objectifying are always somebody’s child, maybe somebody’s sibling and maybe somebody’s spouse.

Users of pornography are also damaged, whether we are aware of it or not. Pornography replaces authentic connections with illusory connections. These illusions prevent the user from engaging fully with family and friends. They become increasingly withdrawn, isolated and irritable when their isolation is challenged, and this prevents them from being the spouse, parent or child they are called to be. Additionally, the chemicals released in the brain have more addicting effects than even alcohol or hard drugs. Finally, because of the shame associated with these behaviors, users begin to live double lives, thinking of themselves as unlovable and believing that if their weakness was discovered, no one could love them and they would lose everything. All of these lies serve to fuel the addictive cycle. Not only does pornography prevent users from engaging in the fullness of human relationships, but, because of the addictive nature of pornography, draw them further into the despair of isolation.


Nevertheless, for those caught in the web of pornography, there is hope, there is freedom. Jesus Christ did not come into this world to condemn it, but to set it free. This includes freedom from the habit of pornography as well. No matter how long or intensely you’ve struggled, no matter how deep this struggle has been, no matter how twisted this struggle has become, exposing it to the light of the sacrament of confession is the first step in the healing process. For the truth is you are loved and that there are resources available to those who wish to win liberation! There is no more nonjudgmental place to reach out for them than in the sacrament of confession.

**MONTHLY REPORTS:**

**School:**

New distance learning equipment has been delivered and both Humphrey and Lindsay have begun to utilize through Lindsay's speech coach.

Covid update: We will be changing the screening process for school students entering the school each day. We have conducted over 17,000 screenings and only detected three students with potential symptoms, one of which was positive. Currently there are two families being impacted by Covid quarantine, and both consist of parents with symptoms.

We did lose one student that transferred to Lakeview over the break. We gained one student from Norfolk Catholic. Enrollment remains the same.

**Finances:**

Little changes with regards to our finances. We continue to encourage weekly offering and thank all those who have continued their regular giving.

**President's Comments:**

We are always looking for opportunities to experience Christ. Father is excited to begin benediction on adoration days. This semester he has all 31 junior high students together for class. Continue to pray for him and our students.

**January Business:**

We discussed at our October meeting methods to evangelize within our parish and community. Lindsay brought forth a couple options to help move us all towards Christ. Our main focus is to bring our parish families back to church. Covid remains an excuse to stay home on Sunday's but not from other gatherings throughout the week. It is disheartening to see our community attend

events outside of church while missing Mass. One thing that was mentioned was implementing a Zoom style bible study, similar to Pints with the Priest.

Evangelization is a topic within the parish council and school board. We do not need more Biden Catholics. We must stand up and represent our faith proudly. Why are we here if we are not making one another disciples?

How do we build a culture of evangelization? We must go out of our way to interact with each other. Sports cannot take precedence over academics. Students are pressured into focusing on sports over faith, and it feels like parents are the catalyst.

What does an ideal high school student look like? We want our students to be disciples in all they do, whether that be in sports or in the stands or in a speech meet. We, as a community, have a great opportunity to praise our students if we see them working for Christ. We encourage parishioners to write a thank you to a student doing good within our school.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**School Board:**

Equipment has been installed for distance learning between Humphrey and Lindsay, along with a Spanish learning module. A donation helped to cover a portion of the costs for the equipment and install.

Covid screening has been changed from 100% of students to a random selection of students being screened. At the time of this meeting, the school had twelve families out with Covid. Recently, there was a survey to inquire about interest in vaccinations for the teachers and staff. The results of this survey are being reviewed.

St. Francis had one student transfer to Lakeview at the end of the semester and one student transferred to St. Francis from Norfolk Catholic to begin the second semester as well.

**Finance Board:**

With the PPP loan funds expected to run out next year, discussions have begun in regards to hosting a campaign or asking for a boost in Sunday giving to cover expenses. At this time, the parish is not looking to apply for a second PPP loan.

**Development:**

The committee is still waiting for final results for the Blue and White Night, but is expecting the results to be close to the last report; approximately \$56k.

The parish pictorial committee continues to finalize the directory. The files have been sent to the print company and edits are currently being completed.

Discussion on the continuation of live stream of Mass was held, and the council was in agreement that it should continue to be streamed at this time for those who are truly unable to attend Mass. In an effort to eliminate the distraction of the live stream due to the location of the iPad in the front of church, Kari Wieseler offered to look into a privacy screen for the device.



### **NEW BUSINESS:**

In an effort to increase the sacredness of the Mass at Lindsay Holy Family, Fr. Olsen has been bringing in various statues to place around the altar in the church. Discussion was held as to the possibility of St. Francis donating one of the two sets of angels to Holy Family. Fr. will look into the origin of these angels and check with the donor if that person can be identified.

Breaking Bread books are going to be placed in the church pews, and all other books are going to be removed. A special thank you to parishioners who donated the books to the parish.

Discussion was held as to the possibility of having the annual 500 Club event in person vs. online this year as the committee is meeting in the upcoming days, and letters will need to be sent out.

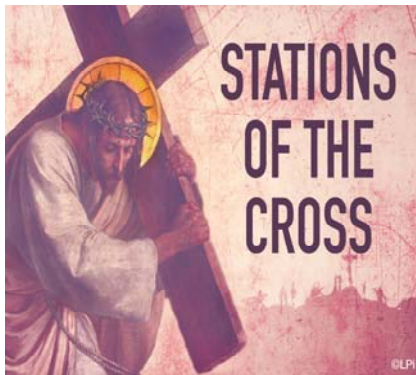

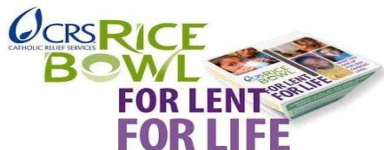
