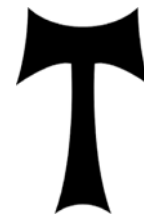

Dear Parishioners,

I love to dance. Since my dancing is about as elegant as an elephant being electrocuted, there is only one place in the world where I have ever danced or will ever dance again. That place is my car. Get some tunes cranking, the head starts bobbin', shoulders start bouncing and even the car starts responding to the beat.

I do sometimes wonder, however, what others must think as they pass by my car. I suppose they think I'm crazy. As true as this may be, the reason they think I'm crazy is insightful. They think I'm crazy because they can't hear the music. For if only they could hear what I hear, they would be doing the exact same thing.

It seems to me that something of the same reality is true with Catholicism. For many, Catholics seem a little crazy. In fact, I don't know how many times I have been asked questions like, "Why do you have statues or pictures of saints in your church? Why do you bless yourself with holy water? Why do you make the sign of the cross? Why do you keep Jesus on the cross? Why don't you eat meat on Fridays in Lent? Why do you sometimes have to go to Church on days other than Sunday? Why do you genuflect before you enter the pew? Why can't your priests get married? Why can't women be priests? Why don't you allow divorces? Why do you forbid the use of contraception?" Of course, the list could go on and on.

They kind of have a point. Catholics do behave a little strangely. Perhaps the gospel of St. Matthew helps us to understand why. In this gospel, Jesus exclaims to His disciples., "Blessed are your eyes because they see and your ears because they hear." It is through these eyes that see and ears that hear that Jesus' disciples are able to hear His music; music that the rest of the world doesn't hear.

This is why we dance when the world thinks we're crazy. As Jesus says, "Many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see, but did not see it and to hear what you hear, but did not hear it." You see, despite all the evil present in our modern society, we are so extraordinarily blessed to be living out our Catholic Christian faith at this time in history; even more blessed than if we lived at the time of Jesus. Why?

The answer is awesome! Each and every occasion of sin is also an occasion for grace. I'll give you an example. One beautiful spring day, I happened to be chaperoning the St. Mary's High School Speech team at the state meet. The meet was held on a college campus. As I was walking with one of the competitors to his competition site, we passed a young coed that was perhaps a little overzealous in her desire to enjoy the warmth of the spring sun. As she passed by, I noticed the young man's head turn a little too profoundly to ogle her as she passed by. Of course, when he discovered that he'd been busted by a priest, he was embarrassed. He squirmed a little and said, "Father, I bet you didn't even notice that."

Naturally, I responded, "What planet do you think I'm from?" Of course, I noticed her. But, when confronted with temptation, we can either follow the path pointed out by my student, a path that leads to the abyss of sin. Or, we can choose a different path and rejoice in God.

With every temptation, with every opportunity to fail, there is also the opportunity to succeed. Unfortunately, if you're anything like me, our human weakness tends to fail far more than it succeeds. Here's where what we do at Mass becomes so important. Ordinary bread and ordinary wine changes into the very Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of God Himself. When we unite ourselves with Him in this holiest of all Communions, we not only truly become what we eat, but we are also strengthened in our ability to turn occasions of sin into occasions of grace.

Of course, to those who don't hear the music, this teaching on the Eucharist, just like anything else that is peculiarly Catholic, seems absurd, scandalous or just plain crazy. But for those who have been given eyes to see and ears to hear, only one response seems fitting. We dance. The Eucharist is the ultimate sign of God's love, not simply for who we are, but also for whom He's calling us to be.

**St. Francis of Assisi Parish Pastoral Council Minutes**  
**May 20, 2021**

The meeting of the parish pastoral council was called to order by President Duane Kosch at 7:00 PM on Thursday, May 20, 2021. Fr. Olsen led the opening prayer. Members present were Fr. Eric Olsen, Erik Baumgart, Ken Classen, Janet Eisenmenger, Dan Fehringer, Duane Kosch, Lindsey Kosch, Taylor Werner and Kari Wieseler. Guest in attendance was Bill Abracht. Bryan Reichmuth was excused.

The minutes from the April 22, 2021, meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**School Board:**

No meeting since last report.

**Finance Board:**

No meeting since last report.

**Development:**

At the time of the meeting the Development committee had received donations of \$43,000 from 192 alumni from the alumni appeal. The committee is proceeding with plans to hold the alumni banquet on Saturday, May 29.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

Adjustments have been made to the church sound system, and it is now working well. Going forward, Ashley Krings is now the contact for the sound system; this way we will have a resource to troubleshoot issues with our current sound system to keep it in good working order.

**NEW BUSINESS:**

Since there is no official grounds committee for the parish, Bill Albracht reported some of the calls/needs he has in regards to decisions to be made for repairs in various areas.

- Folks putting their feet on the kneelers bends the brackets and some eventually are breaking. Bill Albracht has taken care of fixing these.
- The cemetery fence was starting to lean. Bill Albracht recruited some of the mowing people to help fix this on a rainy day. Thank you to all those for your help in taking care of this.
- Windows on the southwest side of the high school (library room) need a coat of paint eight to ten inches below the window. Taylor Werner will take care of this.

- Lamp posts in front of the grade school are leaning, and Bill Albracht is recommending to fix or remove them. Duane Kosch will look into this.
- When the addition to the high school was put on in 2010, there was a space left for a plaque. Duane Kosch will look into taking care of this.
- A window on grade school needs repainting. Duane Kosch will talk to Jim Wiehn about this.

### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

Corpus Christi will be held the weekend of June 5 and 6. There will be an organized procession Saturday, June 5, in Lindsay and on Sunday, June 6, in Humphrey. There will be a Holy Hour scheduled at each of our parishes to pray for vocations to the priesthood.

### **PROPOSAL UPDATE:**

- There will be a subcommittee formed to proceed with working on the proposal, reporting to the school boards at both Holy Family and St. Francis schools.
- Due to low numbers of participating students at LHF and inexperience of freshmen and sophomore students at HSF due to Covid, the decision was made to coop the one-act program this coming school year. Practices will be at St. Francis with Mrs. Schumacher as the head coach of the program. Expenses will be split accordingly based on the numbers of students from each school. Both schools are planning to host a festival at their respective location.
- Smaller group discussions are planned to be held with Fr. Olsen throughout the summer months.

The meeting adjourned at 8:27 PM with a prayer.

The next meeting is scheduled sometime in August; this date is to be determined.

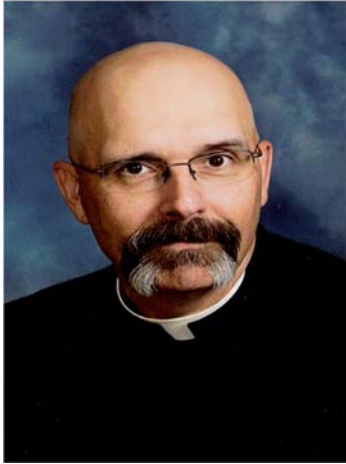
No date has been scheduled at this time for the next finance meeting.
