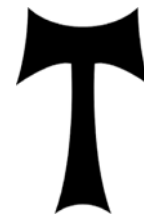

Dear Parishioners,

Anybody that thinks God doesn't have a sense of humor needs to look long and hard at a giraffe. In fact, I like to think of the process of creation as God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit all sitting around a campfire one night drinking beer after beer and trying to one-up each other with the stupid creatures they make. "Ok, let's see you top this," the Holy Spirit exclaims as a hippopotamus appears. "Don't even get me started," Jesus retorts as He creates a jellyfish. "Oh Yeah?" chimes God the Father, "Well let's see what they do with this," pointing to the platypus He just created.

Of course, God's sense of humor is not limited to some of the goofy creatures He created. For example, I find it humorous that I used to work in a field (mathematics) where things were always black and white. Now, however, I "work" in a field (morality) where people seem to think that nothing is black and white.

For instance, I don't know how often people tell me that in morality everything is relative. This is not only dangerous but illogical. The phrase itself, "everything's relative," is an absolute truth; is it absolutely true that there is nothing absolutely true?

It's clearly not true in math. In math, one plus one always equals two, a circle is always a line equidistant from every point in the center and the sum of the square of the lengths of the legs of a right triangle is equal to the square of the length of the hypotenuse.

But, is it true in morality? Is there really any difference in saying "two plus two equals four" and "abortion is wrong", or that "lying is always wrong", or that "assisted suicide is wrong"? The answer is no. For just as truths in mathematics are true for everybody, everywhere, regardless of circumstances, so, too, truths in morality are true, for everybody, everywhere, regardless of circumstances.

This is why a Catholic debating matters of faith and morals such as legality of abortions is really as silly as a mathematician debating whether or not two plus two equals four. Of course, like the debate over whether the world is round or flat, moral issues, even those defined infallibly by the Church, are capable of debate. However, it is the pinnacle of foolishness to debate about something God has revealed.

September 24, 2020

The meeting of the parish pastoral council was called to order by Fr. Eric Olsen at 7:00 PM on Thursday, September 24, 2020. Fr. Olsen led the opening prayer. Members present were Fr. Eric Olsen, Duane Kosch, Ken Classen, Taylor Werner, Erik Baumgart, Lindsey Kosch, Dan Fehringer, Bryan Reichmuth and Janet Eisenmenger. Kari Wieseler was excused.

The minutes from the August 20, 2020, meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

School Board:

COVID-19 related protocols are going well. One teacher needed to quarantine with Zoom instruction taking place.

Mass on the Grass attendance was slightly down this year, possibly due to absence of a coinciding open house. Two new families are now part of St. Francis School.

Homecoming will be held on October 10, 2020.

Grandparents' Day has been postponed due to COVID-19.

Finance Board:

Finances for both church and school are currently positive even with COVID-19. There is a concern about a potential decrease in revenue from both the bazaar and Blue and White Night as well as with the lack of a second collection.

Development:

Blue and White Night will be held on November 21, 2020. Expect a few changes due to COVID-19 including an online auction option. Letters will be sent to alumni informing them of the online auction and asking for financial support. Chad and Crystal Harper and Taylor and Marie Larson will be joining the committee.

OLD BUSINESS:

The parish pictorial directory had no report.

The PPP loan forgiveness applications have been submitted. We have not yet received a response.

The bazaar will take place with modifications due to COVID-19. The meal will be served into take-out containers; seating will be available both indoors and outdoors. Some kids' games will not be available. With the loosening of restrictions, the beer garden will be open and expanded to

accommodate social distancing. The St. Francis Kids' Run will occur as usual. If parishioners are unable to attend the bazaar, they are asked to consider donating the amount they would normally spend at the bazaar or perhaps purchase additional big ticket or raffle chances.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mass is starting to return to normal with attendance rising. Barriers have been removed but social distancing is still encouraged. Holy water is present as well as the music issue in the pews. Still absent is taking up collection and the sign of peace.

October 1, 2020

The St. Francis school board met on Tuesday, October 1, 2020, in the St. Francis cafeteria. Members present were Fr. Eric Olsen, Mrs. Jennifer Dunn, Todd Preister, Lisa Geilenkirchen, Brandon Morfeld, Lindsey Kosch, Brenda Foltz and Ethan Bruland.

Todd Preister led the opening prayer.

There were no guests attending.

The agenda and August minutes were motioned and approved.

MONTHLY REPORTS

School:

First round of parent/teacher conferences under Covid-19 restrictions went well. We had 92% of parents attend the parent/teacher conferences. Considering the circumstances, the book fair was a success. The funds raised go towards stocking both the elementary and high school libraries.

Homecoming will take place with mandatory masks. Homecoming was discussed with the student body, and it was agreed it would take place as long as all students were to wear a mask. The school is looking for volunteers for a DJ.

Veteran's Day will be hosted by St. Francis. It will be different this year with no band or student singers. A small group of student representatives from both Humphrey Public and St. Francis will be in attendance. The program will be open to the public and social distancing will take place.

The required instructional hours by the state remains the same, but there is flexibility in counting them, such as when in a remote learning environment. Due to this flexibility, it was decided to allow teachers a first day of the semester off. The first day off will be October 19.

Finances:

Income appears to be down, but we have not had to ask parishioners for additional funding. Expenses are down as well due to strategic spending.

The long-term outlook will be difficult due to a shortage of qualified teachers with the attributes we seek in a Catholic school. Annual salaries will need to continue to increase to maintain or source new and qualified teachers. Our leading influence will be the visible benefit of a Catholic education.

How do we as a church model our education to the community and surrounding families? We need to lead by example. Covid-19 has revealed what we as a community find important. This all needs

to start with our parishioners and school families. It appears that roughly 40%-50% of our students are attending Mass.

The operation in entirety is expected to fall short by \$180,000 this fiscal year. The easiest method to help this annual issue is to work with the community and estates as our elders begin to plan estates.

October Business:

Covid-19 Update: The DHM is being updated regularly along with protocol for infected or exposed students and faculty. One of the latest updates involves students in close contact with a COVID positive person during an outdoor activity or in a large space such as a gym. These students may not have to quarantine. An option of wearing a mask at all times could replace quarantining.

School quarantine has been working and our main goal is education and parents get to make the choice of safety.

Our health district regulations are now implemented across the state, which requires no change of protocol by St. Francis.

NSAA has updated their requirements for post-season activities. Updates include, but are not limited to, spectators being required to wear face coverings at all times while attending indoor events and outdoor events when social distancing is not possible.

Rickets has allocated 12.5 million to schools for the purchase of electronics for E-learning. The grant will subsidize up to \$400 per device. Would also reimburse for a few teachers laptops purchased over the summer.

The next meeting will be held on November 10, 2020, at 7 PM in the school cafeteria.

Thank you to Pat and Denise Brockhaus for their donation of new padding for the weight room in memory of George Brockhaus.

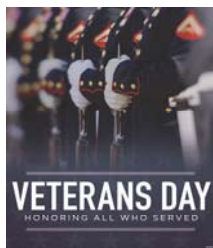
