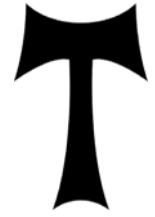

Dear Parishioners,

One of the characteristics that distinguishes the Catholic Church from other Christian denominations is our understanding of the saints. While other Christian denominations would recognize the reality of saints, only Catholics realize their connection with us. Saints are our older brothers and sisters that already won the race we are running and now wait at the finish line, cheering us on.

One of the ways we thank them for their encouragement is by celebrating the day they received His eternal reward - the day of their death. You see, much like the greatest athletes of professional sports celebrate, annually, the day they entered their hall of fame, so, too, the Church annually celebrates the day one of her own, the saint, entered the ultimate Hall of Fame - the kingdom of heaven.

There are, however, notable exceptions to this general rule. Two are perhaps obvious because we not only celebrate their birthdays, but also the days of their conception as well. Jesus, whose birth we celebrate at Christmas, is also celebrated at His conception nine months earlier with the feast of the Annunciation. Mary, whose birthday we celebrate on September 8<sup>th</sup>, is also celebrated nine months “earlier” on December 8<sup>th</sup> with the feast of the Immaculate Conception. Only life that is already human is worthy of being honored and celebrated as saints, as the Church does with Jesus and Mary. This is part of the reason why the Church has always taught that human life begins at conception.

Science agrees with this truth of faith. The human embryology textbook used by the University of Nebraska Medical Center states “Human development begins at fertilization [from which develops] the highly specialized cell (zygote) marking the beginning of each of us as a unique individual.” You see, life begins at conception, and both faith and science recognize this. If both faith and science confirm that life begins at conception, it does make one wonder, how could any rational person, but especially those claiming to share our Catholic faith, support its destruction?

Unfortunately, it gets even worse. With abortion as an established norm in the West, the attack on human life has expanded to the harvesting of embryonic stem cells. This process can only be compared to the cannibalization of one class of human beings so that we might use their parts in order to fix another class of human beings. Clearly no moral person could support the use of one class of people as spare parts for another class of people. If we truly trust both science and our Catholic faith, this is precisely what is happening through the process of embryonic stem cell research. The only differences between embryos and you and I are cosmetic; they are younger.

Compounding this phenomenon is the acceptance of fertilization methods that result in the creation of multiple embryos so that the best, most viable one may be implanted in the mother. I wonder what becomes of this “lucky” child’s brothers and sisters that were left behind in a cryogenic hell?

What is our reaction? Do we buy into the rationalizations that these embryos, these tiny masses of cells that our faith tells us are human beings, are disposable since they are going to be destroyed anyway? Or, do we believe the faith we claim to profess, by standing up for those who are defenseless, those who are voiceless, those who are condemned, and those who are really our least brothers and sisters. I pray that more people will do the latter, since, as Jesus says in the gospel of Matthew, "Whatever you do for these least brothers of mine, you do for me."

**St. Francis of Assisi Parish Pastoral Council Minutes**  
**August 30, 2022**

The meeting of the parish pastoral council was called to order by President Duane Kosch at 7:01 PM on Tuesday, August 30, 2022. Fr. Olsen led the opening prayer. Members present were Fr. Eric Olsen, Erik Baumgart, Janet Eisenmenger, Duane Kosch, Taylor Werner and Kari Wieseler. New parish council members, Spencer Eisenmenger and Sarah Kessler were also present. Ken Classen, Dan Fehringer and Bryan Reichmuth were excused.

The minutes from the May 31, 2022, meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**School Board:**

The 2022-23 school year has kicked off and new faculty have been welcomed into the Science, Business, Music and Kindergarten classrooms.

Mass on the Grass was held on the first day of school and went well this year with the number of attendees increasing from last year.

The Archdiocese held two meetings with our cluster families; one at St. Francis, Humphrey, and one at Holy Family, Lindsay, and they went as well as expected.

**Finance Board:**

Church subsidies are down from last year. Operating savings and Sunday collection has been the difference.

The status of the rectory building was discussed. With the lack of office spaces for current parish staff, the purchase of the house across the street is being considered.

**Development:**

Nothing to report.

**OLD BUSINESS:**

The pillars in church have been cracking/flaking. Duane Kosch reached out to the company that had done the painting, and they have since retired. However, they have provided instructions on how to patch any cracks should we find someone to assist in the repair of cracked paint. Various members have agreed to reach out for further assistance with this project. Taylor Werner will reach out to the St. Michael's, Tarnov, parish to see who assisted with their painting. Kari Wieseler will reach out to a contractor to obtain potential contact information. Spencer Eisenmenger also has a contact to reach out to for assistance.

Three parish council members have come to the end of their three-year term. Duane Kosch and Ken Classen have served their consecutive service terms and the parish has voted in new members, Spencer Eisenmenger and Sarah Kessler, Thank you Duane and Ken for your service to the parish.

The grade school has a bat problem that is getting increasingly worse. Duane Kosch and Taylor Werner met with the bat exterminator, and he is unable to evaluate the current situation and provide a quote until next fall. Sarah Kessler has agreed to call various pest technicians to assist with a potential short-term fix in the interim until we understand the continuation situation of the grade school.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

It has been brought to Fr. Olsen's attention that the carpets in the church could use a professional cleaning. Kari Wieseler has the contact information to reach out to Jim Wemhoff for an assessment.

### **PASTOR'S REPORT:**

The Pastoral Planning Committee has been meeting since May and are expected to begin building a plan that they can submit to the Archbishop by November. The Archdiocese has provided a 17-page template in essay-formatted questions that can be utilized by these families to develop their plan. Current discussions by the planning committee include potential new positions needed to serve our cluster families. These could include an evangelization coordinator, Director of Religious Education, maintenance coordinator, coordinator of Sacramental prep and a position to coordinate finances between our cluster parishes and schools. These positions would need to be held by individuals aside from the priests. Discussion was held on what staff may be able to assist with these positions.

The Archdiocese recently agreed to hear meetings regarding the schools. They expect to have further internal discussions and then debate on whose responsibility it will be to make a decision and communicate it to the community.

Fr. Olsen welcomed the new members of the parish pastoral council and thanked the existing members for their contributions over the years. Officers were appointed at the meeting: Taylor Werner was nominated and seconded by vote as the new president, Erik Baumgart was nominated and seconded as vice president and Kari Wieseler was voted in for secretary.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 27, 2022, at 7 PM.

The meeting adjourned at 8:10 PM with a prayer.
