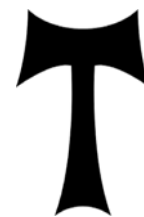

Dear Parishioners,

There aren't many of us who like to do chores. However, if there is one advantage our chores have over the people living in Jesus' time, it is that our chores; if not easier, they are usually less important. To illustrate this point, simply look more closely at the gospel of St. John. In this gospel we see one of the daily chores common to the people of Jesus' day; the procurement of water. Most Jews would often have to travel significantly, maybe even miles, to draw the water that they needed in order to survive.

Imagine for a minute how difficult this most essential of chores would have been. Not only would this water have to have been drawn from a deep well, but it would also have to have been carried, usually uphill, back to the place where it was needed. Since this task was both arduous and time consuming, it was usually done at the beginning of the day by groups of people. In this way, the burden of this chore was lessened both by the social dynamic of a community project and by avoiding the midday heat.

Imagine, then, how unusual it would be for a lone woman to draw water, by herself, in the very heat of the afternoon. It really seems that this woman is in the wrong place at the wrong time. For she is about to be confronted in one of the strictest taboos of that day by being in the company of a single man, Jesus, all by herself. Compounding the gravity of this scandal was the additional scandal of ethnicity. The woman is a Samaritan. Jesus is a Jew. Both Samaritans and Jews were prohibited from interacting with each other. But coincidence is simply God's way of remaining anonymous. Nowhere is this clearer than in the gospel. Through her chance encounter with Jesus Christ, the life of this notorious woman is transformed.


Notice how Jesus engages this woman, He attempts to reach her where she is by establishing a common bond; the need for water. But Jesus doesn't leave the woman where she is. Rather, He attempts to draw her to a deeper understanding of God. How does He do this? By simply asking her to call her husband.

But there is a problem. For as the woman replies, she has no husband. Here's where it really gets interesting. For to this Jesus responds, "You are right in saying, I do not have a husband.' For you have had five husbands, and the one that you have now is not your husband. What you have said is true." Ouch! Imagine what our response might be to such an insensitive statement.

But how does this Samaritan woman respond? The woman says, "Sir, I can see that you are a prophet." This amazes me. Instead of becoming angry or offended she recognizes the truth given to her by Jesus, and, in turn, this truth ends up setting her free.

I think this is an important lesson for all of us living in our non-judgmental and politically correct society. In our effort to protect the feelings and sensitivities of our brothers and sisters, we can sometimes err in charity. In fact, it may very well be that what is needed for them to come to some form of conversion is the same thing the Samaritan woman needed to facilitate her conversion...that somebody to have the moral courage to tell them the truth.

St. Francis of Assisi Parish Cemetery Board Minutes
September 7, 2021

The St. Francis cemetery board held a meeting on Tuesday, September 7, 2021, in the rectory meeting room. The meeting was called to order at 5:30 PM by Fr. Eric Olsen. Members present were Fr. Olsen, George Keller, Alan Ternus, Craig Ternus, Doug Eisenmenger, Michael Wegener, Steve Wieser and Karen Wieser. Absent was Gib Preister.

Fr. Olsen led the board in an opening prayer.

St. Francis Cemetery:

Four rows of concrete were poured in the new acre section the first week of September.

Discussion was held on price per plot. It was decided to increase the price per plot by \$50.00 for all three cemeteries being St. Francis of Assisi Cemetery, Humphrey; Sacred Heart Cemetery; Cornlea and St. Mary's Cemetery, rural Humphrey.

Discussion was held on selling graves in the new acre section. Effective immediately we will continue to sell graves/plots upon completion of rows in the New Acre Section before we begin a new row.

Monument companies must contact a St. Francis, Sacred Heart or St. Mary's cemetery representative when ordering the monuments to make sure regulations are met on the size of the monument and also that the headstones is installed correctly.

A reminder to all plot owners who purchased a cemetery plot, please purchase your monuments within one year after purchasing your plot. This helps Gib Preister, Doug Eisenmenger and Carl Jarosz when it comes time to mark and dig a grave especially in the winter months when the snow covers the ground.

The volunteers are only responsible for cutting the grass in the cemeteries. All other maintenance (upkeep/improvements) of burial plots is the responsibility of the family of the deceased or deed holder.

St. Mary's Cemetery:

Three rows of concrete were poured at St. Mary's Cemetery the last week of August.

Pastor's Report:
