

THERE WILL BE FIRST COMMUNION PRACTICE ON <u>SATURDAY</u>, <u>APRIL 14 AT 10 AM</u>.

ONE PARENT IS REQUIRED TO ATTEND ALONG WITH THE FIRST COMMUNICANT.

Dress code for First Communion day is as follow:

Girls: White dress, vail (if you want), white shoes, white socks or tights. No gloves please.

Boys: White long sleeve shirt, tie, dark pants and dress shoes.

Reminder: The only reserved seating is for parents and the First Communicant. All other family members is a first come first serve on getting a pew for seating.

No flash photography is allowed.
