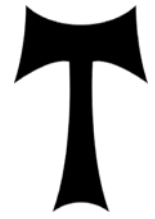

Dear Parishioners,

Every so often, someone will ask my opinion on what bible he or she should buy. My normal response is to buy whatever bible you will actually read. There is one caveat to this general advice, however. A Catholic should take precautions to ensure they own a “Catholic Bible”.

Why is this important? Well, for the New Testament, it really isn’t. All bibles, Catholic and Non-Catholic, contain twenty-seven books in the New Testament. The Old Testament, however, is not. In the Old Testament, Catholic bibles will have seven books that non-Catholic bibles will not. If your bible doesn’t have these books, then you do not have all of the written words divinely inspired by God.

Of course, one might ask why there is this difference, especially when it involves the Old Testament. To answer this question, we must first recognize that, even at the time of Jesus, there was not a defined list of books held to be divinely inspired by God. In fact, one of the major religious debates of Jesus’ day was whether or not the books written by Moses, the first five books of our bible, were divinely inspired by God. It wasn’t until around 90 AD, nearly sixty years after Jesus’ resurrection, that the Jewish authority decided on the thirty-nine books they believed to be divinely inspired by God.

Obviously, the Church moved on a different path, and this would take a while. In the year 393 AD, the Church decided that, in addition to the thirty-nine books accepted by the Jewish authorities, it would include seven other books as inspired by God to comprise the Old Testament. The twenty-seven books that comprise the New Testament were also determined at this time. These seventy-three books became the Christian bible.

Notice what this says about the bible. For four hundred years there was no bible, and yet the Church grew by leaps and bounds. It is this spoken word that informed us of the written word, which is why that spoken word coming from the Church is more foundational than even the written word we know as the bible.

For nearly twelve hundred years, all Christians accepted the authority. However, in the 16th century, the Protestant Reformation re-examined this issue. In an effort to distance itself from the authority of the Church of Rome, some of the reformers noted that one of the books that most clearly supported the doctrine of purgatory, the second of book of Maccabees, was not considered to be inspired by God according to the Jews. It was in one of the seven other books included by the Church in 393AD. As a result, they argued that, since the Jews were guardians of the Old Testament, we should listen to their authority in determining which books belong in the Old Testament. Consequently, they removed these seven books considered by the Jews not to be divinely inspired by God from the Old Testament. This is why, today, Protestant bibles have sixty-six books, while Catholic bibles have seventy-three.

Here’s where the problem arises. After the birth of the Church on Pentecost, the Jews were no longer

guardians of God's divine revelation. Jesus Himself transferred that authority to St. Peter, as we hear about in the Gospel of St. Matthew (cf. Mt 16:13-19). Thus, the authority to determine what is inspired by God and what is not does not reside with the Jewish authorities as of Pentecost. It is the sole province of the Church established by Jesus Christ Himself on the rock of St. Peter. This is why all Catholics should ensure that they have all the books inspired by God in their bible. It is through all seventy-three of these books that God's divine, written word is transmitted.

The opening prayer was led by Fr. Olsen.

The minutes and agenda were motioned and approved.

Election of officers took place for the 2022-2023 school year. President; Ethan Bruland, Vice President; Todd Preister and Secretary; Lisa Geilenkirchen.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Administrator's Report:

Saxon math, which is currently being used at the grade school level, is going out of business and therefore not printing anymore. The school was able to purchase two years of copies. This will give us time to look into something else.

The enrollment in the grade school is 137 students and the high school has 85 students. The overall enrollment is higher than the previous year.

There was an update on the new teachers joining the school faculty. There will be two substitute teachers starting the school year. One teacher is out on maternity leave and another is coming from overseas.

Grades 7-12, there is a plan for developing a group prayer time in school once a month for 30 minutes; this will be led by community leaders.

Implementing common grading beliefs is a work in progress at the high school level. The goal is to have the academic grade be reflective of the students' knowledge and understanding of subject matter. Christian behaviors and work ethic (attributes) will be a separate grade.

Finances:

Nothing to report.

President Comments:

Fr. Olsen is excited to see kids excited about their faith. Some are coming to summer weekday Masses and confession. The high school prayer group that is forming will be great for the kids to capitalize on their faith.

August Business:

Mrs. Dunn gave an instructional unit report – basically stating we need accredited teachers and students taking certain classes to meet the requirement of hours.

The handbook was updated with the lunch policy change that there will be no seconds if the families lunch account is below \$.00.

There is a human sexuality policy that is faith based and represents Catholic teaching. This policy will be reviewed and included in the handbook after January 1, 2023.

There will be Family Planning meetings being held at Holy Family and St. Francis of Assisi. The meetings are led by the Archdiocese. The first meeting will be informational, including statistics and trends occurring, and there will be a follow-up discussion meeting with an opportunity for parishioners to provide input.

The next meeting of the school board will be held on September 6, 2022, at 7 PM.

The closing prayer was led by Mrs. Dunn.
