Dear Families,

As you are aware, late last week we submitted three name and mascot combinations to the Archbishop for his consideration. We want to thank everyone who has been praying for our team and our communities during this time.

Today we are excited to share the name and mascot selected by the Archbishop: Archangels Catholic High School Defenders. If you recall, when we submitted the name recommendations to the Archbishop we also included a brief explanation of how the name would represent the communities and the core values that emerged during our process. Below is the explanation that was submitted for Archangels Catholic High School.

This name is inviting to all in our Family of parishes. When our Family of parishes was established, the St. Michael the Archangel prayer became a unifying prayer amongst us. The Archangels represent great attributes that our students should emulate as the result of quality Catholic education. Gabriel is the messenger of God; we want our students to spread the word. Michael is the defender; our children should be armed and ready to always defend their faith. Raphael is the healer; our students through their faith can help bring healing not only to our communities, but to the world. This name is unique; to our knowledge there are no other high schools in the area with this name.

As we mentioned in our very first letter, this team is committed to creating a path forward so that we can thrive in the future of a new Catholic high school where our children can continue to grow in their faith. It's because of that commitment that we have continued to work on the necessary steps for a successful school year beginning this fall. Earlier this week our team met with the Chief Financial Officer of the Archdiocese to seek guidance on funding the new school and will continue to work with his team for direction.

The work has just begun, and we will need the partnership of additional parishioners and school family members to ensure all necessary steps are executed well. In the coming days, groups will be formed to work on pieces of the transition process. These groups will be guided by the Transition team along with Father Stan's oversight. The initial areas of focus will be finances, staffing, culture, and branding.
