Dear Parishioners,

As the weather begins to get colder and the chill is in the air, we prepare to celebrate a month of remembering and a month of thanksgiving. We remember in a special way our loved ones who have gone before us and pray that they may be with our loving Savior in the kingdom of heaven. We do this through having Masses said specifically for them, which is the highest form of prayer; lightening candles and offering our own prayers for them so the prayers continue as the candles burn; or writing their names in the remembrance book which is put out so they may be remembered with all the poor souls at each Mass prayed for during the month.

We are also called to remember and reflect upon the many gifts and graces that God has given to us during the past year and give Him thanks. Many of us get so busy with all the day-to-day things that need to be taken care of that, over time, we forget that everything we have, everything we have been given (our talents, abilities, etc.), even life itself, is a gift, a Grace from God. He loves us so much that He showers His graces upon us each day, leading us and caring for us without our even knowing all that He does for us.

Giving thanks is an essential aspect of our relationship with God and true genuine gratitude transcends all boundaries (cultural, religious or social) because it is rooted in faith. When it comes to our faith, the Eucharist is the central sacrament. Interestingly Eucharist is derived from the Greek word meaning "thanksgiving". In the Eucharistic celebration, we express gratitude for the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and God's redemptive love. I would not say there is much love in our community at this point. There is much more division. People wanting this or that and digging their heals in for this thing or that. The Eucharist invites us, if nothing else, on a spiritual level, to acknowledge the transformative work of God in our daily lives, to become more like Christ, to become what we receive. If we open our hearts and souls to this transformative power, then the healing balm of Gilead can begin to heal our woundedness.

That is what I have picked up so far from reading the book called: *The Healing Power of the Eucharist is Real*. So many in today's world don't believe in the real presence of the Eucharist. That our Lord Jesus Christ is really present in the consecrated bread and wine. It is such a sad case of affairs. The book I've been reading speaks of how precious it is to see Christ in the Eucharist and to spend time in Adoration so that one can draw more closely to our Savior and become more united in our lives with Him. It is in this means of communication with Him that we can be transformed and truly see Him as our all, the one who suffered and died just for me, coming to have that personal relationship with the Son of God that we so often long for in our lives. Our protestant brothers and sisters have this piece right in that we need to accept our Lord Jesus Christ as our personal Lord and Savior.

We as Catholic's have an extra piece to it in believing that Jesus is truly and substantially present in the Holy Eucharist, the healing power of Christ can be realized and experienced in our live; and, through us, in the lives of those around us. As we then go through this coming month, I ask you to remember all the blessings you have received and open yourself to Christ in the Eucharist so we may be healed.

St. Francis Grade School Board Minutes September 3, 2024

The St. Francis grade school board met on Tuesday, September 3, 2024. Members present were Fr. Stan Schmit, Mrs. Jennifer Dunn, Jared Wiehn, Brent Reichmuth, Ann Olmer, Katie McPhillips and Diane Noonan.

Fr. Stan opened the meeting with a prayer.

The September agenda was approved.

School board minutes now need to be approved by the school board prior to them being put in the Tau for publication.

May and August minutes were approved.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Administrator's Report:

Still working out the bugs for the Educate and TADS system, but overall it is going well; no equivalent to PAN. Some teachers have been utilizing Google chat for messaging. Parents can always email teachers directly.

Continuing with the Google calendar for parents and staff moving forward working with Educate/TADS staff to make a better version of the calendar for future use.

A new family joined our school, Koal and Jackie Weidner. First grader and third grader transferred from the public school.

FINANCES:

Fr. Stan stated not anything noted that is overly concerning. Will continue to watch finances overall.

Need to discuss further to potentially hire an elementary school principal for the next school year or increase secretary's role(s). Overall need more help as the class sizes have grown and need to be able to meet the demands of the grade school as well as the high school.

PRESIDENT COMMENTS:

Confirmation has been set for March 23, 2025, at 2 PM for all five parishes with Archbishop George Lucas present. Fr. Stan is discussing with Fr. Dan to have students interview prior to Confirmation.

First Communion is either the last Sunday of April or the first Sunday of May. Still discussing with Fr. Dan.

First Reconciliation: Continued conversations for what date(s) work for teachers. Either sometime in December or first part of January.

Fr. Stan has continued to see students in the grade school classrooms.

Preschool: Mrs. Dunn reached out for clarification on rules for getting preschool under the St. Francis wing. Mrs. Dunn is continuing to work on this further.

Recruiting for one more school board member. We are waiting for more applicants to proceed with a vote.

The next St. Francis grade school meeting is scheduled for October 8, 2024, at 7 PM.

St. Francis of Assisi Parish Pastoral Council Minutes September 16, 2024

The meeting of the parish pastoral council was called to order by the president, Spencer Eisenmenger, at 7:07 PM on Monday, September 16, 2024. Fr. Stan led the opening prayer. Members present were Fr. Stan Schmit, Spencer Eisenmenger, Dan Fehringer, Sarah Kessler, Ann Olmer, Bryan Reichmuth, Steve Wieser and Kari Wieseler. Brad Stallbaumer and Erik Baumgart were excused. Several members of the finance board and Mrs. Dunn were also in attendance to discuss the topic surrounding the motor coach bus.

A big thank you to Dan Hastreiter who has donated a lot of time and materials to repair and keep the motor coach running since it was gifted to St. Francis. Prior to the start of this school year, the bus was taken to Navigator for repairs and a decision was needed on the amount of funding it will take to complete these repairs. Parts needed to complete a full repair are close to \$20,000, not including labor, so looking at close to \$45,000 to complete all repairs after a very thorough inspection. Lots of discussion was held regarding what could be done to ensure it could safely be released back onto the road, and which repairs could be completed later and put into a future budget. Mark Kuchar has agreed to go back to ask Navigator to prioritize the repairs on the current quote and he also offered to volunteer his own time to help with some of the labor to help keep cost down. Spencer Eisenmenger made a motion to proceed with the repairs if the total does not exceed the amount in our repair budget and the commitments received from several generous community members at the time of the meeting. The motion was seconded by Bryan Reichmuth, and nine members of those in attendance were in favor of this as well.

The minutes from the August 12, 2024, meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

School Board:

Everything is going well with the Educate and TADS systems. Teachers are still working out a few bugs. These is no Pass-A-Note option for messaging teachers, so parents now need to email teachers directly.

We are welcoming two new students, a 1st and 3rd grader, into our elementary. Koal and Jackie Weidner have transferred from Madison Public School.

Fr. Stan brought up the idea of potentially hiring an elementary school principal for next year. We are blessed with a growing elementary which is requiring more support. Discussion was held on whether the increased workload on Mrs. Dunn is due to the transition year or if this will continue going forward. No decision has been made at this time.

At the time of the September 3 school board meeting, there was still only one applicant for the open school board position, so there are not enough members to proceed with a vote.

Mrs. Dunn has reached out for clarification on the rules for getting the St. Francis preschool under the K-6 school system. School board continues to discuss this.

Finance Board:

Fr. Stan decided to move to quarterly meetings for the finance board. The next meeting is planned for October.

Development:

The Catholic Order of Foresters is planning this year's Big Red Bash for October 26. Blue and White Night invitations are planning to be sent out the first part of October with the event being planned for November 23. Both fundraisers are important for our schools.

OLD BUSINESS:

There were no updates at the time of the meeting regarding the Parish Cluster Parish Pictorial or church carpet.

There was a request by a community member for permission to pull weeds and clean up Fr. Wayne's sanctuary area. The council agreed that there would be no issue with this. Spencer Eisenmenger will reach out to the interested party to gain details about the potential ideas surrounding the clean up. If needed, there were other potential ideas for service projects, etc. surrounding this area of the high school.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Archdiocesan Annual Appeal is coming up in September though the end of the fiscal year. The 2024 goad for St. Francis parish is 33% participation and a monetary goal of \$31, 320. The total goal for our parish family is \$67,500.

There was discussion held regarding the Nebraska Opportunity Scholarship. This option surrounds tax bill 753 and allows entities to offset their tax liability by 50% by designating the funds to a particular school. It looks as though the fund distribution needs to be decided by October, but Bryan Reichmuth and Spencer Eisenmenger are looking into more details surrounding this option and what it would take to educate our community in taking advantage of utilizing this opportunity.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Classroom visits have begun this fall.

Fr. Stan will pass along annual appeal information as he receives it.

The Unity Mass went very well and the individuals from the parish cluster did a phenomenal job with planning and organizing the event. There was a great turnout and the weather was great for this celebration Mass.

Our Advancement director, Ashley Krings, will be assuming more of an over arching role for the entire parish family in regards to development of our parishes and schools. Fr. Stan and Ashley are in the process of forming an advisory board to assist with what and how we work through future developmental planning.

With some recent active shooter situations, the question was asked on whether there is something in place for the schools and Fr. Stan confirmed that there is an active shooter plan in place.

Mass times will change to the winter Mass schedule beginning in November.

The air conditioning has been installed in the gymnasium and is working very well. There was some concern about having the controls locked and only enabling certain individuals to have access. It was proposed that Fr. Stan, Mrs. Dunn and the athletic director/assistant athletic director have access to changing this.

Discussion was held on the frequency and attendance of the parish council.

The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, October 16, 2024, at 7 PM.

The meeting adjourned at 9:11 PM with a prayer led by Fr. Stan.
