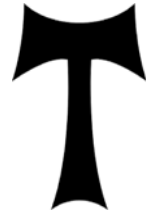

St. Francis of Assisi School Board Minutes
May 21, 2024

The St. Francis school board met on Tuesday, May 21, 2024, in the St. Francis parish office meeting room. Members present were Fr. Stan Schmit, Mrs. Jennifer Dunn, Brent Reichmuth, Katie McPhillips, Todd Preister, Ann Olmer and Jared Weih. Diane Noonan was excused.

Katie McPhillips opened the meeting with a prayer.

Math was added to the curriculum.

Meeting agenda was approved by Todd Preister and seconded by Katie McPhillips.

The minutes of last month's meeting were approved by Ann Olmer and seconded by Todd Preister.

MONTHLY REPORTS:

Administrator's Report:

Mrs. Dunn announced that Mrs. Sheila Hassenstab has announced her retirement but will remain on site for training on new hire. The school board thanked and emphasized how great she has been for the school.

Humphrey St. Francis High school was awarded \$2,000 for a grant from NDE and money will go to new cameras for the parking lot and gym lobby.

It was noted that Pejay Padrigon was temporarily out of compliance due to expired permit while moving to Humphrey; but since has been awarded new permit and now in good standing.

Finances:

Fr. Stan noted that we are behind on Sunday contributions and we are strong on current subsidies.

President's Comments:

Fr. Stan has ranked his first year here at school as good and is very excited for the new change and looking forward for next year.

Noted that there was only one interested in the grade school school board and we need three potential names for a parish vote.

Currently waiting on Fr. Stan's new associate from the Archdiocese.

New Business:

Saxon math is going out of print and the new math standard is not matching up very well with Saxon. Teachers along with Jami Brandl did some internal research on the new program “Expressions”. Pros and Cons were stated and it was decided for a slot start into the new program. Some Saxon and Expressions will be mixed in as needed. Next year will be as follows:

K-1st Grade-Expressions
2-3rd Grade-Saxon
4-6th Grade-Saxon

TADS and Educate has taught us there will be a \$40/\$55 “Processing Fee” for any kids attending Humphrey Saint Francis and an additional \$40/\$55 “Processing Fee” for any kids also attending Humphrey Saint Francis High School.

Next school year will be getting ideas on a matching \$200,000 grant opportunity.

Pre K-K Program was discussed and if added to the school a request by Mrs. Dunn was suggested to add another Principle to the Grade School/High School. The program will continue to fall privately under Mrs. Ramaekers and topic was tabled for the fall.

Was voted to remove the comment “To be eligible for graduation, a senior must have met all financial obligations. A senior will not receive an official transcript of grades until all financial obligations are fulfilled”.

Fr. Stan noted that very few families ask for a plan to pay past due tuition and it is an option for those who can pay in full immediately.

HSF High School:

All five parishes are monetary giving to the school per the Archdiocese.

No conversations about new uniforms, logo, etc for next year.

The board thanked Todd Priester for this was his last meeting as his term is up.

The next meeting is scheduled for August 6, 2024, at 7 PM.

The meeting was adjourned with a prayer led by Fr. Stan.

St. Francis Grade School Board Minutes
August 6, 2024

The St. Francis grade school board met on Tuesday, August 6, 2024. Members present were Fr. Stan Schmit, Mrs. Jennifer Dunn, Brent Reichmuth, Katie McPhillips, Ann Olmer, Jared Wiehn and Diane Noonan.

Fr. Stan opened the meeting with a prayer.

Election of new officers: Fr. Stan was unable to appoint a new member. He is waiting for more applicants to come forward to elect (1) new school board member.

President – Brent Reichmuth; Vice President – Ann Olmer; Secretary – Katie McPhillips

Agenda was approved and added discussion about distribution of funds in regards to second collection for Catholic schools.

May minutes, Jared Wiehn needs to get these minutes to Mrs. Dunn.

Special guests were Mackenzie Eisenmann and Suzanne Beltz. Discussed Federal lunch program and new updated wording to contract that includes “no discrimination based on sex, gender, identity, etc.” This does not fall within our Catholic values and discussion was had on how to potentially move away from the Federal lunch program within our schools and daycare. Fr. Stan advised to seek out legal counsel from the Archdiocese if we are considered exempt from the new updated Federal wording/guidelines.

Daycare turf was discussed. Little Saints Daycare received a large grant and plan on turfing the lawn south of the daycare outdoor play area for all student use. The daycare is asking to help decrease cost to move one bathroom within the daycare that the grant did not cover. Jared Wiehn placed motion to approve. Katie McPhillips seconded the motion and all approved.

School-Mrs. Dunn-Elementary enrollment is 146 students.

Mackenzie Eisenmann and Suzanne Beltz are splitting the school cafeteria duties for 2024-2025 school year.

Jennifer Weidner has started as grade school secretary, taking Sheila Hassenstab’s position.

Educate is a new school platform. Teachers received training on August 6 and this will also be connected to each families TADS account for easy viewing and access. Within the new Educate system teachers have the capability to add Archdiocese standards to pertinent assignments.

FINANCES:

Fr. Stan reviewed and discussed.

PRESIDENT COMMENTS:

Fr. Stan has sent three possible dates forward for approval for Confirmation to the Archbishop for approval. A date has been approved.

Weekly school Mass schedule will stay the same.

On August 15, after the 8:10 AM Mass, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and process around to the high school to the chapel for time of prayer. All are welcome to attend.

Bus option-Mrs. Dunn. Mr. King approached and offered to sell us a bus they were planning on trading in. For now given our current system of utilizing their busses for free we will pass on this option.

Grade school building option: Fr. Stan has not heard back if we are able to move forward from the Archbishop. Fr. Stan is hoping for an answer in the spring of 2025.

Distribution of funds: The second collection of Catholic education, Fr. Stan stated all monies will sit in a fund and will be split amongst the following: St. Francis grade school, Archangels high school, PRE, St. John Neumann grade school and Holy Family grade school.

The meeting adjourned with a closing prayer led by Mrs. Dunn.

The next St. Francis grade school meeting is scheduled for September 3, 2024, at 7 PM.

August 12, 2024

The meeting of the parish pastoral council was called to order by the president, Spencer Eisenmenger, at 7:05 PM on Monday, August 12, 2024. Fr. Stan led the opening prayer. Members present were Fr. Stan Schmit, Spencer Eisenmenger, Dan Fehringer, Sarah Kessler, Ann Olmer, Bryan Reichmuth, Steve Wieser and Kari Wieseler. Brad Stallbaumer and Erik Baumgart were excused.

The minutes from the July 22, 2024, meeting were reviewed and approved as written.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

School Board:

Mackenzie Eisenmann and Suzanne Beltz are looking at trying to cover the cost of money we currently get from the federal government for our school lunch program by fundraising to avoid having to abide by the government's regulations that could possibly conflict with our Catholic beliefs.

Little Saints Daycare asked St. Francis School to pay the additional \$5,800 balance for renovations not covered by a recent grant they received. To help cover new turf installation on the patch of grass south of the daycare where St. Francis students play during recess. The parish council approved this request.

There has still only been one application for the open school board position.

K-6 enrollment for the 2024-25 school year is 146 students.

Mrs. Dunn will be sending out an email soon with login information for parents to access the new Educate information system that will be replacing Sycamore.

There is a planned Mass for unification for all five parish families at 10 AM on Sunday, September 8, 2024, at the football field.

Finance Board:

There has been no finance board meeting since the last report, so there is no update to provide at the time of the meeting.

Development:

Donation requests for Blue and White Night have been sent out to past donors.

OLD BUSINESS:

Thank you to St. Francis Alumnus, Braden Fraudenburg, and other parishioners who donated their time, and talent and treasure to clean up the landscaping around the south side of church.

Three quotes were obtained for new carpet in the church, and samples were provided to the council for review. Motion to proceed with fundraising for this carpet was approved by Steve Wieser and seconded by Spencer Eisenmenger. It was agreed that there should be a smaller committee formed to decide on the best color, style, etc. for the church.

The replacement of light bulbs in the church will occur at the time the carpet is replaced.

There were no updates at the time of the meeting regarding the Parish Cluster Parish Pictorial as Fr. Stan continues to work on plans.

NEW BUSINESS:

Steve Wieser found someone to paint the exterior south and north windows of the church and requested permission to proceed from the council. Motion was approved.

There was a request by a community member for permission to pull weeds and clean up Fr. Wayne's sanctuary area. The council agreed that there would be no issue with this.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Classroom visits are planned for this fall.

Fr. Dan Wittrock has been adjusting well to the parish and will start taking on duties of weddings and funerals soon.

Fr. Stan has been considering names for our parish family and will bring to a vote once a few options have been decided upon.

The next meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 16, 2024, at 7 PM.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20 PM with a prayer led by Fr. Stan.

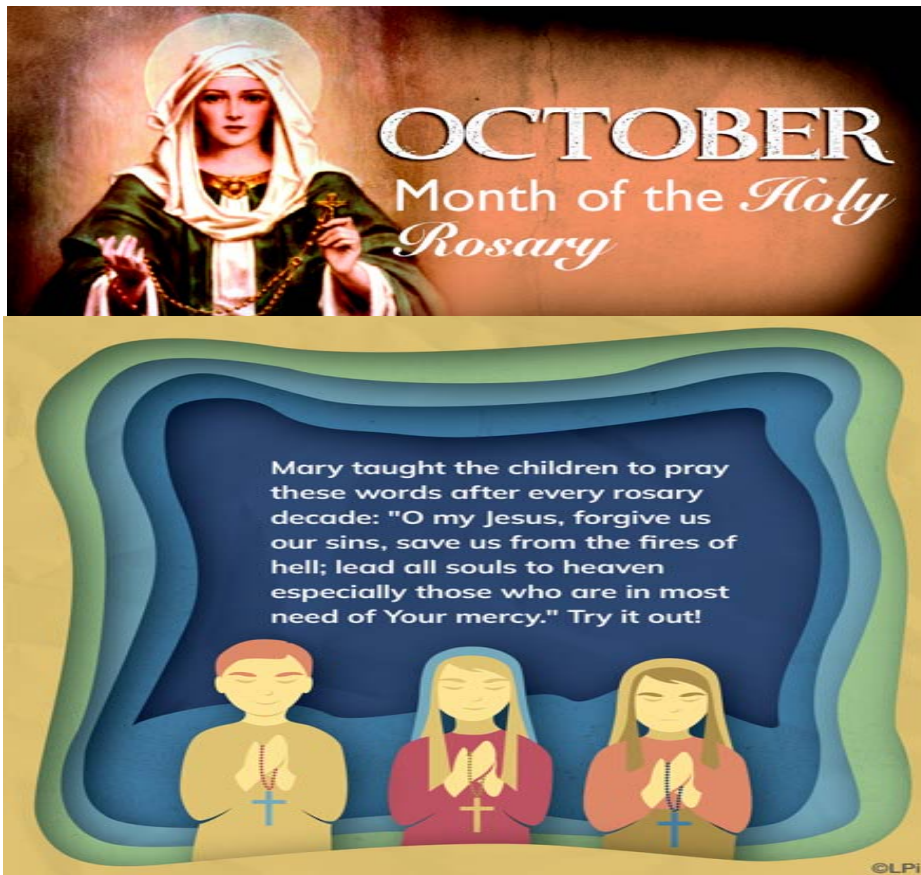
