A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT

FATHER STAN SCHMIT

A year has passed and over the year I have learned many things. The piece which was most gratifying was how many students took advantage of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and taking time to honor our Lord in the Holy Eucharist. Over the last three years, the Church of the United States has been centering around the Eucharist and asking us to regain that connection to Our Lord through His Body and Blood.

During the past two months people from across the country joined in the National Eucharistic Pilgrimage accompanying Jesus from city to city, lighting hearts on fire, ending in Indianapolis, IN, for the National Eucharistic Congress where members of our Catholic family gathered to experience profound, personal renewal through the power of Christ's love.

As we prepare for the new school year, we are working on ways to tie into this spiritual connection that is present and add more time, not only for students to partake in these opportunities to experience God's grace, but to also learn about their Faith and other ways to connect with our loving Savior.

One way, if the student chooses, will be through Christian Prayer, the Prayer of the Church, also known as Liturgy of the Hours to priests and religious. This prayer opens us up to listening to God's word through the psalms and short readings. This brings together that aspect of praying always. Many parishes that can no longer have Mass, due to priest shortages, use this prayer to gather together to give praise to God. Students will also gather weekly for prayer and discussion. Another way is through retreat opportunities, not only with their class during the school day, but also through archdiocesan and national programs.

Through these and other opportunities, it is our hope that the students, over time, will find their niche to remain close to Jesus and grow in their spiritual lives.

Please join me in asking God to light our hearts on fire and allow that fire to spread throughout our school community.

A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL

How do I make sense of all that is happening with our school? In reflecting on this past year and anticipating the year to come, I do so with a spiritual lens.

Mrs. Schumacher and I were talkingabout the conversation she had

with Sr. Laura Ann (2013 graduate) when she came to visit this spring. She was being interviewed for an article that appeared in the April edition of the alumni newsletter. In their conversation, Sr. Laura Ann was asked how it was living in a convent. She proceeded to tell Mrs. Schumacher (and I'm paraphrasing here) that she felt blessed for the opportunity to live with both saints and sanctifiers. She offered that she was certainly a sanctifier.

That comment has stuck with me. I think about it often.

Saints are those who you would love to emulate-the kind souls, full of God's love, those that radiate joy, people you just want to be around. Sanctifiers, on the other hand, are those people who you may find difficult to live with or whose personalities don't mesh well with yours; their little quirks get under your skin; those people that make your life difficult. We all have both kinds of these people in our lives. Her comment helped me to see what a blessing it is for God to give them to us. Because in giving them to us, we have the opportunity to work on ourselves. We can identify areas from within that can improve. Sanctifiers help us become saints.

I find Sr. Laura Ann's mindset to be particularly inspiring this year because I am not limiting it to people. I consider events in our lives as having the same effect. People and events—both can be sanctifying. Our school community has gone through a lot this year. We can think about the events we have endured or continue to endure, with the school

in the same way. We experienced more profoundly this year sanctifying events-unpleasant, challenging situations; Events that have really challenged us to look inside. We can ask ourselves, "Why?" "What now?" "How do I move forward?" "How is God using this situation for my sanctification?"

In a letter from St. Paul, he responded to being stoned and left for dead, all because he was trying to teach others about Jesus. He told his disciples when they came to find him, "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the Kingdom of God."

Reflecting on this year we just experienced, I can only be thankful and praise God for all the blessings we have received—our academic successes, our athletic achievements, and our adversities. I pray that I may grow spiritually from the events endured this year. I also pray for open hearts of all in this school community to benefit from the sanctifying events presented to us and use them to grow in holiness.

In order to offer Catholic education in this area, it is apparent we have to undergo hardships. And in doing so, hopefully we individually, and as a community, can spiritually benefit as well.

Please continue to keep our school community in your prayers.




